GETTING TO KNOW YOU: A TWC Member Contest

We have lots of new members to get to know- and old members for them to meet. We'd like to encourage everyone to wear a name tag, so we can all put names with faces. In light of that, the club is sponsoring a little contest for members who joined the group on or after January 1, 2022. These folks will have the months of February AND MARCH to work on a personalized name tag- the wooden blanks and magnets are available at our meetings- just ask one of our instructors or officers. Make yourself a name tag that expresses your personality; you can carve it, attach a little carving, do wood burning, or painting, or a combination of techniques. Then, send a picture of your tag to Carol Adair (secretary)- or have her photograph it at the meeting. The best tags will be determined by a vote of our members in APRIL. Prizes will be given for the best name tags in two categories: Junior (under 18) and general (18 and older); if you already have made a name tag, you can use it for the competition.


In the near future, we will be placing another wood order. Please let us know if there are sizes that you would like us to get. You can look on the Heinecke website for the sizes they carry.


