GETTING TO KNOW YOU: A TWC Member Contest

In light of that, the club is sponsoring a little contest for members who joined the group on or after January 1, 2022. These folks will have the month of February to work on a personalized name tag- the wooden blanks and magnets are available at our meetings- just ask one of our instructors or officers. Prizes will be given for the best name tags in two categories: Junior (under 18) and general (18 and older); if you already have made a name tag, you can use it for the competition.


If you need special cuts (example: diagonally cut a 2x2), we can make arrangements to take care of that with a slight upcharge per cut.
