

BREAKING NEWS

IMPORTANT UPDATE FOR HICKORY SHOW ATTENDEES

There is construction in progress at the Hickory Metro Center, which limits parking in the usual deck and lot. There will only be 100 spaces in the parking deck. There will be 2 remote lots: One at Carrabba's Bar & Grill, and one behind and up the hill from the Metro Center. They may not have availability of drop off and will probably offer shuttles. You may want to arrive early, especially if you have bigger stuff to carry in. And you may want to pack your carvings as compactly as possible and bring a wheeled container that you can load onto a van shuttle.

WOOD SPIRITS



Attention New Members!!! Once you have completed your 5 basic projects, you are encouraged to find new projects that interest you to carve. Please use our library to find new items to carve; and talk with other carvers to get new ideas.

Pat Patrick has volunteered to work with new carvers on Wood Spirits when they have finished their basic projects. Check with him at Monday meetings. It's a great introduction to carving faces.

Pat Patrick has volunteered to help you learn to carve a wood spirit. Just let him know if you are interested in that. Also, remember that there are monthly classes on carving, painting, etc., in the smaller room going on weekly from 4-5:30 pm. Use the sign-up sheet to get on the monthly list.
