**Next Meeting, Monday, February 3, 2020** - Miller Park Community Center, Winston-Salem, NC — Carving from 3:00 till 9:00 pm. People come and go at their convenience. # At Our Last Carving Session

There were forty-seven members and visitors at the carving session on January 27th. There were four guests for the spoon carving demonstration and seven other visitors. Joe Davis, who is a member of Charlotte Woodcarvers, showed examples of the spoons that he carves from **green wood** of various kinds. Tad Kepley, who is a member of Davidson County Woodcarvers, demonstrated his methods for carving spoons from green wood using a Viking Axe and several kinds of knives and carving tools. He actually carved a spoon from green cherry, demonstrating some of the most difficult parts of spoon carving for everyone to see. It was a very effective demonstration. The Charlotte Showcase will be held Saturday and Sunday, February 22-23. Ray Branch will be giving an **Orientation** for how to participate in the show at 5:30 this Monday, February 3. He will review registration procedures and explain categories. He requests that those who have registered bring their Confirmation and Check-in Form and he will help with filling it out. There will be copies of the show brochure available if you don't have one. This orientation promises to be very beneficial as Ray was the chair of the Charlotte show in past years.

Newer members are encouraged to come to the Orientation and consider participating in the show. The Novice Category is for, well... novice carvers, so even the newest carvers should consider entering a carving or two.

Triad Woodcarvers has **challenged** the Piedmont Woodcarvers of Mauldin, SC (near Greenville) to see which club will enter the most carvings in this competition. After the show Triad Woodcarvers will be raffling off 20-25 incentive awards to all members who entered the competition.

The Charlotte Show is the largest woodcarving show in the Southeast. There will be many vendors, exhibitors, professional carvers and free mini-seminars. It's a wonderful way to pick up good values on knives, wood and other woodcarving supplies.

"**Spoons**" and "**Spirit Faces**" are this year's cash award categories, and with the demonstrations this past week and the classes on spoons this coming week, we seem poised to bring home some of the spoon cash—and that includes in the Novice Category.

The Triad Woodcarvers will host a Club Table at the show with items for sale to raise money for Club projects. If any members are willing to man the Club table or carve for this fund raiser, please see Tim Trudgeon.

## **Minutes from January General Business Meeting**

#### January 6, 2020

This Triad Woodcarvers Monthly General Business Meeting was called to order by President Stewart Hodges at 6:35 pm at the Miller Park Community Center in Winston-Salem. There were 32 members and 9 visitors present. The following Officers and Directors were in that group:

Charles Griffin, Treasurer was absent because of illness. The proposed amendments to Triad Woodcarvers' Bylaws were presented to the membership and discussed. In particular the following items were considered:

• Will Crawford recommended that the minimum age for Junior Members should be 12 years, and others suggested that an allowance be written into that section to allow for exceptions to the minimum age requirement by a vote by the Board of Directors. We already have some members under the age of 14.

• Judith Ruff and others recommended that the Monthly General Business meetings be held earlier because so many people left before 6:30. Others felt that the Business Meeting should not be held earlier because members who work would not be able to get there while the rest of the members should be encouraged to stay for the meeting.

• The Board of Directors agreed to review their recommendations and submit it in writing to the membership by email and postal mail for discussion and a vote at the General Business meeting on February 3, 2020. Two thirds majorities are required to pass changes to the Bylaws.

Pat Patrick made a motion that we have more than one door prize at each meeting and give one out around 5:00 and one after 7:00 so that both those who come early and those who stay late would have a chance at a prize. The motion passed.

Ray Branch reminded the members that we have committed to provide Saturday woodcarving demonstrations once a month at Klingspor's, and he has a schedule that he is trying to fill. He has Vince McHenry and Tom Mock signed up for Jan 11 and needs more volunteers.

Tony Leonardi announced that he is still looking for a couple of members to serve on his Fund-Raising Committee. This job is not really as difficult as it sounds. Lots of members were paying their dues for 2020, and others are reminded that the membership rolls will be reduced by those who have not paid by March 1, 2020.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 pm.
