### Next Meeting, Monday, November 23, 2020, at Miller Park Community

**Center** in Winston-Salem. We do not yet know what teaching will be on tap for this meeting.

There will be two carving sessions (one group from 3:00 pm till 5:00 pm, and another group from 6:00 pm till 8:00 pm). We will have two rooms available for use and each will have a limit of 9 people. There is an hour between each session so the Community Center Staff can clean the space to prevent Covid virus collection on surfaces.

Tim Trudgeon has taken on the responsibility of coordinator between our club and the Community Center for our return to regular Monday meetings. There will be a few hoops to jump thru but we can easily manage them. Attached is a copy of the Waiver of Liability regarding Covid-19 which spells out most of the rules we will have to adhere to.

We will have two opportunities on each Monday to attend our group sessions. One group will meet from 3-5pm and one from 6-8pm. There is an hour between each group so that the staff can clean and arrange furnishings before the next group arrives. Below is a list of procedures which we will ALL be required to follow. NO EXCEPTIONS.

- Please do not attend if you or anyone from your household have any signs of illness.
- Upon arriving, members are required to wear a mask from the time they eave their car until they are back in their car.
- Arrival will be at the main, front, door.
- Your temperature will be taken, sign in and then sign and date the Waver of Liability. (Under 18 must have parent/guardian's signature).
- Hand sanitizer applied at this point and prior to returning to the class. Suggest that you bring some of your own hand sanitizer.
- Once in the room, maintain 6' distance from each other. Once seated, masks may be removed. You may talk and eat.
- Masks can stay off as long as you are in the room and 6' apart. If you have to leave the room for any reason, you must mask-up until you return.
- Maximum limit in the room is 22. If a visitor would like to come they will be one of the 22.
- Participants must wipe down tables and chairs with cloths and a solution, which will be provided, when thru for their session.
- **All members must pre-register** with Tim Trudgeon for which slot (early or late) that you wish to attend.

- Exit from the building will be through the rear door.

Once we go thru this routine a few times it will become rote. We may be advised later if we'll have to sign the waiver each time. Tim will sign up for the early slot each day so he can get out the locker and get things ready. Someone with a locker key will have to come to the 6pm meeting to lock up. We already have three signed up for the early "shift". If you decide at the last minute to come, give Tim a call at 336-414-4660 to see if there are any vacancies. The number 22 matters more than who it is. **CONTACT TIM SOON TO RESERVE YOUR SPOT!**

## $STEM \sim Woodcarving \sim Fall \ Semester$

Today (November 19, 2020) was the final day of class for the woodcarving students—Beginners and Advanced. Three female and six male beginning students completed a series of carvings ranging from a basic Mushroom to a Moravian Star. The two, male, Advanced students completed a beautiful Santa as their final project. Will Crawford served as lead instructor with Charles Griffin, Stewart Hodges and Carol Adair assisting.



*Triad Woodcarvers* teamed with **STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) last year to teach woodcarving to Home-Schooled students as an elective to their curriculum. This year marks our second completed instructional session. Seven of the nine in the Beginner's class have already signed up for next year's Advanced class. We are expecting a total of four Beginners and seven Advanced carvers in the Spring Semester beginning January 12, 2021.

Thanks to the instructors who gave their time and talent for 26 carving classes this semester; and, thanks to *Triad Woodcarvers* for giving back to our community!

We understand that these little carvings mean a lot to the families whose members (especially children) are in the hospital. Charles Griffin has challenged every member to carve one or two and turn it in before the end of the year.

### **AND ON TO 2021!!**

**The Charlotte Showcase of Woodcarvings** has been deferred from February, 2021 to **JUNE 25-27**, **2021.** While we are not participating in a Challenge as we did in 2020, nonetheless, we are encouraging Triad Woodcarver members to enter the competition. We were the most active club at the 2020 Show and would like to be again in 2021. We had 31 carvers enter in 2021 and would like to have 50 Triad Woodcarvers enter in 2021. Show theme is: **Everything Tom Wolfe.** The Club has numerous Tom Wolfe books. Pick up one and make a Tom Wolfe carving.

**Triad Woodcarvers Events For 2021**. The Club is planning for 28 activities during 2021 including 10 days at the Carolina Classic Fair, 14 days at Klingspor's, Bethabara Apple Festival, Horne Creek Historical Farm, two library demos for a month or more each. While our success will be dependent on Covid, many of these events are for the later part of 2021 and we feel confident that we will be able to participate in most, if not all, of them.

**Triad Woodcarver Meeting Programs.** Plans are to continue the successful program of classes which were begun in 2020 with bottle stoppers, spoons, pyrography, relief, Christmas ornaments, Chip carving, caricatures and others being considered at this time. We already have a commitment of TOM GOW - a member of the Southern Highlands Guild to teach a class on wood-bark carving in 2021. And others depending on membership interest.

#### Read-Write-Spell & Triad Woodcarvers Art Show and Fundraiser:

Triad Woodcarvers has partnered with ReadWS – an organization dedicated to providing mentorship to children to enhance their skillset in the areas of reading, writing and spelling - to cosponsor an ART SHOW. It is expected that 70-100 artisans – including two dimensional art (paintings, drawings, etc.), woodcarving, jewelry, ceramics, pottery, etc – will participate. This ART SHOW, originally scheduled for November, 2020 had now been deferred to NOVEMBER 6, 2021.

Triad Woodcarvers are urged to participate and to date, 28 members have indicted that they will enter this ART Show. It is about one year away now and penny of time to turn out some of your best work. Note that David Boone – perhaps the USA's top professional carver – has graciously agreed to show a couple of his works to promote the art of woodcarving. Darlene Tarleton, one of the best animal carver in the nation, has also agreed to show here as well.

Further details regarding registration, forms, schedule, etc. will be available in the next few weeks.
