Carving session on Monday, September 13, 2021:

We will meet at the Miller Park Community Center in Winston-Salem as usual, from **4:00 to 9:00 pm.** We can have as many people as we like until we get too crowded to carve, so it is no longer necessary to make reservations. Masks are required in the building because of the youth programs there and continuing Covid-19 restrictions.

President Stewart Hodges has called a meeting of the Triad Woodcarvers Board of Directors on September 13th, at 6;00 pm at the Community Center. (This Board Meeting may be held outside at one of the shelters if the weather is nice.) The Board includes all elected Officers, and Directors of the club. Committee Chairs are also encouraged to attend as nonvoting members to discuss plans for future activities of the organization. This is an important meeting for our club, PUT IT ON YOUR CALENDAR.

We will have these Carving Sessions every Monday, but the Covid crisis has caused the cancellation of several special programs of carving instruction. However, the instruction of new carvers will continue during this time.

The Triad Woodcarvers Club is bringing **nationally recognized professional carver and teacher, Tom Gow** to Winston-Salem to teach a class on Cotton Wood Bark carving. He will hold his class at Klingspor's in Winston-Salem on Friday and Saturday, September 10th and 11th from 9:15 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. on Friday and 9:15 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. on Saturday. The cost is \$100 plus the cost of the wood.

Cotton Wood Bark comes from trees in the Northwest United States and Canada. It is about 4-6 inches thick and is easier to carve than basswood. You do not have to be an expert carver to carve Cotton Wood - a beginner can do very well and it is a lot of fun. Usually houses of odd shapes with windows, doors and stairs are carved in the wood bark.

OCTOBER - On October 4th, Carol Mock will teach jewelry carving. This will be only one night.

NOVEMBER - On November 8th and 15th, at 4:00 p.m., Lynne Patrick will teach Pyrography.

The STEM Program has added a new Pyrography Class for this semester. Lynne Patrick of the Triad Woodcarvers Club was asked to teach a Beginner Pyrography Class. She has five students, two boys and three girls. These classes are held on Tuesday afternoons from 12:30 - 2:00 p.m. The first class was held on Tuesday, August 31. The students are excited to learn Pyrography and this should lead to younger people learning to carry on this type of art. Over the next 13 weeks the students will learn how to use a wood burner, how different tips will create a design, and how to care for the equipment.

If this adventure is successful, it could lead to more advanced classes with STEM and in turn, possibly lead to more members for the club.
