The Club recently purchased some northern basswood from Heinecke in Minnesota in various sizes and 12 inches in length. We had to pay for freight, and that cost has been factored into our selling price and rounded to the nearest \$0.25 increment. The wood was purchased in this manner because there have been no carving shows (our normal place to get wood) in the last couple of years due to the pandemic.

This wood is for Club projects, STEM, and for our members. CHARLOTTE SHOWCASE OF WOODCARVING

While we are not participating in a challenge as we did in 2020, we are encouraging Triad Woodcarver members to enter the competition this year. We were the most active club at the 2020 Show and would like to be so again in 2022. We had 31 carvers enter in 2020 and would like to have 50 Triad Woodcarvers enter in 2022. The showcase is scheduled for April 1-3, 2022 at the Central Piedmont Community College central campus (Worrell Building, 1228 Elizabeth Avenue, Charlotte). STEM UPDATE

The Triad Woodcarvers Club was highlighted in the 2021 Summer Issue of *Chip Chats* for our partnership with STEM. Many of you are aware of this partnership, but I would like to share some more specific information regarding the evolution of this partnership. First to briefly recap, the program was started in 2019 under the direction of Tim Trudgeon with the assistance of Will Crawford. The program was an outreach on behalf of the Triad Woodcarvers Club and was the brainchild of Ray Branch. Ray thought that TWC should try to expand the art of woodcarving to another generation as a legacy to our club.

We have embarked on this journey, and we are nurturing a new generation of carvers and now pyrographers, since in the fall of 2021 STEM was asked if we could also offer wood burning. Thanks to the commitment of Lynne Patrick we are now in our second semester of wood burning. Lynn had five students last semester and has three this semester. Pyrography is off to a great start.

The carving program has continued to grow and change with each semester and with the students' increased desire to learn more. To date, this is our eighth semester of carving with a total of 60 enrollees in the carving program. Roughly 80% of the enrollees have completed the beginners and advanced carving classes, and about 20% of the enrollees are now members of the STEM Carving Club. The Carving Club for STEM students is similar to our carving club in that the students are already proficient in carving basics and safety and this offers them a time to meet and improve their skills and craft. Carving club students are assigned more difficult projects and are introduced to patterns and methods for transferring and cutting them out.

Spring Semester 2022 started on January 24 and is a 13-week semester. This semester we have eleven students that are all registered in "Advanced Carving" or "STEM Club "classes. What this indicates is that we have eleven students out of the 60 enrollees (over the past three years) who like carving and wish to continue developing their skills in this art form.

This is great! A new generation of carvers and pyrographers is being nurtured thanks to TWC. Our legacy is well on its way to fruition but we need more membership involvement in this endeavor. Currently the instructors are Lynne Patrick (pyrography) and in woodcarving we have Stewart Hodges, Larry Bailey, Carol Adair and Will Crawford. We enjoy working with STEM but would love to have more instructors to help carry the load and build our legacy.
