Upcoming classes...

Carol Mock will lead a class in jewelry making, and Steve Bower will instruct members on how to use your phone to photograph your carvings. The dates for these classes will be announced in a future newsletter.

Jim Carpenter will teach duck decoy carving starting on June 6 and continuing until the carvings are finished. Jim is one of the foremost carvers of birds in the country. Additionally, his painting skills are on par with Michelangelo, Rembrandt, Whistler, and Tony Leonardi.

Jim Carpenter will provide the blank, eyes, bottom board, and weights and will demonstrate and teach painting techniques. Wood provided will be either bass or tupelo.

CHARLOTTE SHOWCASE

The April 2022 Charlotte Show included 125 carvers entering 1073 carvings in competition. The Triad Woodcarvers had a major impact at this show with sixteen TWC members (13.8% of the total) entering 176 carvings (16.4% of the total). TWC carvers earned 82 awards including: Best of Show Theme, Open by Stewart Hodges; Best of Chip Carving, Novice by Carol Mock; Best of Religious, Novice by Michael Ritch; Best of Cotton Wood Bark, Novice by Sara Reinthaler. It is very rare for one club to be awarded four Best of Category awards, and our members won tons of first, second, third and honorable mention ribbons. We have a great Club and some great carvers!

Will Crawford hosted an impressive booth publicizing the STEM program, Jim Carpenter served as a Judge and Norval Van Sickle was a vendor for Cotton Wood Bark and Cypress Knees.

Twenty-nine TWC members attended this show as the Triad Woodcarvers Club continues to be a major supporter of Charlotte's show.
